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Guidelines for obtaining points

1. To receive fifteen points for attending a SMART Lunch for assistance, students must
 - a. Attend a full 30 minute session
 - b. Be engaged in studying math. This may include but is not limited to
 - i. Completing Homework
 - ii. Correcting former tests
 - iii. Involved in an math study group
 - iv. Asking questions of instructor or other qualified students
 - v. Organizing/reviewing notes
 - vi. Completing Flash cards
2. Peer Tutoring – the student receives 10 points for tutoring another student at SMART LUNCH.
3. Your instructor will initiate opportunities for students to earn miscellaneous engagement points, such as: Come in before 1st period for help, present a problem in class, etc. The problem must be accurately completed and the student must be able to explain in detail the solution to the problem for the entire class.
4. To receive points the signed interim must be returned after interims are published.
5. To receive credit for test corrections

NO TESTS WILL LEAVE THE CLASSROOM.
 - a. Students must show all work leading to a complete correct answer before the next test.
 - b. You should be able to tell whether the errors were things you just didn't know or careless mistakes, entry errors, etc.
